

PROCLAIMING A DAY OF PRAYER

Whereas: The responsibility for maintaining right relationship between this nation and God is given to the church, and

Whereas: In times past when this nation has strayed from the commands of God it has fallen to the church leaders to call for the people to confess their failure and to repent for the ways that they have failed and to turn from wickedness and recommit to heavenly obedience, and

Whereas: In this year of 2017, this is a call to "Hear O Lord... for Thy Name Sake" to Prayer and the power enshrined in calling on Divine intervention.


"National Day of Prayer" - May 4, 2017
